



Cameroon

Cameroon's oil resources and agricultural potential give it one of the best commodity economies in sub-Saharan Africa. However, it still contends with many of the typical problems of underdeveloped nations.

The earliest known inhabitants of Cameroon were the Pygmies, who still live in the south and east. Bantu speakers from central Africa came later, and in the 1700s, an Islamic people called the Fulani conquered most of northern Cameroon.

NEEDS

Cameroon's religious landscape is very much a mixture of Catholicism and African traditional religions. The gospel is needed to penetrate every area of life.

Church planting is a basic need throughout Cameroon, especially in urban areas such as Yaounde, the capital.

Because seventy-five percent of the population is under the age of 25, young people form a large subset mission field.

Biblical Christianity is not well-established in Cameroon. Therefore, discipleship and leadership development are critical to the long-term success of church planting.
